

GABRIEL'S MESSAGE

The angel Gabriel from heaven came, His wings as drifted snow, his eyes as flame; "All hail," said he, "thou lowly maiden Mary, Most highly favored lady," Gloria! For now a blessed Mother thou shalt be,

Thy son shall be Emmanuel, by seers foretold,

Reader 1 In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a young woman engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. Her name was Mary.

Gabriel Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you.

Reader 1 But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.

Gabriel Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. His reign will have no end.

Mary How can this be?

Gabriel The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. For God nothing is impossible.

Mary Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word. My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.
