





SECOND READING: Romans 13:8-14



Music Notes | A Multitude of Voices

In an effort to create a fuller and more inclusive picture of the richness of our musical heritage, we will be exploring music composed by women, BIPOC, and other historically under-represented composers.

This fall we will be focusing on women composers, including music composed by Sarah MacDonald, Mel Bonis, Jessica French, Stephanie Martin, Joy-Leilani Garbutt, and others. Despite being historically under-represented in the musical canon, women have been active contributors to all eras and styles of music from antiquity to contemporary.

This morning's psalm chant was composed by Sarah MacDonald. Sarah was born in Canada and now lives in the United Kingdom where she is Director of Music at Selwyn College, Cambridge (the first woman to hold such a position in an Oxbridge chapel) and head of the girl choristers at Ely Cathedral.

In an effort to create a new experience in communal worship, we will also be exploring the wealth of lesser-known hymnody. Each month, we will be singing a hymn at the presentation that hopefully no one knows. This experience allows us as a worshipping community to experience something new together. So please remember to make a joyful noise...even if it feels unfamiliar and a little uncomfortable!

Music at the Rentrée

The Rentrée is an excellent time to get involved in music-making at the Cathedral.

The Cathedral Choirs

Our **Canon of Music, Zachary Ullery** would be pleased to receive enquiries from people interested in joining and auditioning for the following various groups. Please contact him at <u>music@americancathedral.org</u>.

- **The Childrens Choir**: this group meet once a week during term time on Wednesdays at 17h and prepare pieces for two Sunday services a month. We accept children from ages 8-13 and a focus is made on the development of their general musical skills (sight reading, aural perception and theoretical thinking).
- The Youth Choir: this is a progression from the Childrens Choir for ages 14 to 18 who sing with the Adult Choir three Sundays per month. Here, the commitment is greater, and focus is made on the efficiency of their musical output and ensemble skills. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. 8:00 p.m. and Sunday 9:45 am 12h00 p.m. (during term time).
- **The Adult Choir:** Following the tradition in many Episcopal and Anglican churches, the Adult Choir performs a central role in our Eucharist services. Singers of all nationalities and faiths are admitted by audition. A good level of English as well as strong sightreading and vocal skills are required.

- **Professional Singers:** The Music Department is looking for talented professionals to sing, when required, as part of an octet at weekly Eucharist and Evensong services. Exceptional sight-reading skills are essential as well as a flexible approach to different musical styles. Interested applicants should send their CV to <u>music@americancathedral.org</u>.
