Each of us enjoys and appreciates the varied gifts of our community in different ways (Youth Group, Worship, Sandwich Ministry, Coffee Hour, Music, 20s/30s, the list goes on...), but each of us gives for the same reason: to love and be loved in this place and to share that love of God in tangible ways with each other and the wider world. Tax Deductibility

In France, gifts to our Cathedral receive an income tax credit equal to 66% of the amount of the gift. Those who need a receipt for US tax purposes can still pledge through the Cathedral but will need to give through the Friends of the Cathedral (americancathedralfoundation.org/ways-to-give).

Please consult your tax advisor to confirm how these rules apply to your situation. Donation receipts for tax purposes will be sent to donors during the first quarter of the following year.



FAQs

What is a pledge?

Just like household budgeting, our Cathedral family must plan its budget every year to ensure that we can meet the needs of our community and help the world around us. A pledge is a best guess about how much money a household will be able to give to our Cathedral home in the coming year. All of our pledges together give our Cathedral the best information possible for budgeting.

Why pledge when I can just give?

Pledging allows our Cathedral to plan ahead in order to be as effective as possible. What kinds of outreach to the community can we do? How many staff members can we afford? What needs should we prioritize with the resources we have? Each year, pledging allows our Cathedral to be able to look into the future, make ministry decisions together, and with confidence, say, "We will, with God's help."

Don't we have an endowment?

We do have an endowment that was generously left to us by previous generations who are still a part of our Cathedral family as members of the Communion of Saints. Our Cathedral benefits greatly from our endowment. It allows us to dream in ways that would not be possible otherwise. However, we must be good stewards of this gift by only drawing a small percentage to provide for future generations, as well. Therefore, the majority of our day-to-day costs are covered by the pledges and gifts we receive each year.

How much should I pledge?

How much to pledge is a decision that each household prayerfully makes with God. Tithing (giving 10% of one's income) is suggested in scripture. Many people work up to this amount. No pledge is too small or too large as long as it represents an honest and joyful offering from the heart as a response to God's gifts and our hopes for our Cathedral home.

When should I pledge?

The sooner, the better! The earlier we all pledge, the better our Cathedral can plan. We ask to receive all pledges by Pledge Sunday on 11 February 2024, when they will be celebrated and blessed during the 11am service. Our clergy and vestry have already submitted pledges for 2024.

What payment methods does the Cathedral accept?

We welcome payments by cash, card, bank transfer, check, and stock in both euros (€) and US dollars (\$).
